

A huge amount of effort went into cattle at the National Junior Angus Show (NJAS), even before they ever entered the showring. Two members of the National Junior Angus Association (NJAA) know this well. Jackson Wingert, Ottawa, Kan., and Jared Radcliffe, Weston, WI, were both recognized with the Junior Herdsman of the Year award at the 2015 NJAS, July 13-18 in Tulsa, Okla. They were selected for their commitment to the Angus breed and the NJAA.

"The NJAA has been a great organization to be involved with," Wingert says. "I've learned so much that I have been able to use and now share throughout my future."

The Junior Herdsman of the Year award recognizes NJAA members who show
