


coordinating teams at various industry levels will allow our organization to more effectively provide the face-to-face relationships and professionalism for which Angus is known."

Wisconsin Beef Improvement Bull Test

Breeders from Wisconsin, Iowa and Illinois have tested 105 Angus. Red Angus and Simmental bulls through the Wisconsin Beef Improvement Test at the Pioneer Farm Platteville. The top two thirds of the bulls will sell April 2 in Platteville. The 72 Angus bulls had a 3.82 average daily gain, highest of any bred on test and a 3.38 weight per day of age.

Biddick Farms, Inc., Livington, WI, consigned the top indexing Angus, Bull 33, a February 2015 son of KG Solution 0018. He posted a 5.06 average daily gain (ADG) and a 3.94 weight per day of age (WDA) and has a 126.4 index.

Another February KG Solution 0018 son from the Biddick consignment has a 121.6 index, third highest of the Angus bulls. He, Bull 31 has a 4.91 ADG and 3.79 WDA.

Biddick Farms had the Top Indexing Breeder Group.

J. Scott Hoffman, J&S Angus, Soldiers Grove, WI has the second high indexing bull, Bull 49, a March 5, 2015 son of AAR Tex X7008 SA. He has a 4.91 ADG, 3,73 WDA for a 122.1 index. Another son of AAR Tex X7008 SA, Bull 50. ranked fourth with a 4.87 ADG; 3.58 WDA; and 119. ratio.

Bull 15, a VAR Discovery 2240 son consigned by Wolters Farms, Inc., Cuba City, ranked fifth with an ADG of 4.40; WDA, 4.01 and index, 122.9.


At 84 days on test, the bulls have an average daily gain of 2.32 and a 2.83 weight per day of age.

A bull from the Emerald Lane Angus, Melvin and Sharon Niemann, is leading the test with an ADG of 4.28 and WDA of 3.49, achieving ratios of 143.39 and 115.97. He is Bull 8-2, a February 17, 2015 son of V A R Discovery 2240.

Andy and Amy Strasburg, Strasburg Angus, consigned Bull 17-1, a February 2015 son of Koupals B&B Identity that is making a 4.14 ADG and 3.96 WDA for ratios of 138.95 and 102.24.

Changes In Bylaws

American Angus Association® members will now notice a change in voting eligibility following bylaw amendments passed at the American Angus Association 2015 Annual Convention of Delegates last November.

During that meeting, Association voting delegates passed three amendments to the bylaws that affect who can serve as an "eligible voting member" and the timing of the nomination period.

Eligible voting members are those who are able to nominate, be nominated, vote or be elected in the annual election of delegates. To be considered an eligible voting member and participate in the election process, individuals must meet all of the following requirements within the preceding 12 months from when the nomination period begins:

- Active regular or life membership
- · 18 years of age or older
- · Registered at least one animal or completed a minimum level of business

with the Association or Angus Genetics Inc. (the dollar amount specified by the Board of Directors is \$250, exclusive of membership fees, merchandise or other exclusions)

The nomination period for 2016 begins April 11; therefore, above criteria must be met by the end of the previous business day, Friday, April 8, to participate in the 2016 delegate process, according to Chris Stallo, vice president of operations.
