In Memory of Frank J. "Lud" Hlavac

Frank J. "Lud" Halvac, 90, passed away Monday, January 5 at Agrace HospiceCare, Fitchburg.

Born in Castle Rock, WI. he graduated from Platteville High School. He jointed the U.S. Army in 1943, served in the European Theater and was honoroably discharged in 1946. He graduated from UW-Platteville (Platteville State Teachers College) where he earned his Bachelor's Degree and later earned his Master's Degree at UW-Madison. He taught and coached at Clinton and Edgerton High Schools and in 1955 became the first head basketball coach at the newly opened Monona Grove High School.

He was selected Wisconsin Coach of the Year in 1970 and was inducted into WHSBCA Hall of Fame in 1979.

Frank and Mary Jean Dochnahl were married in 1954. In 1978 Frank and Mary Jean retired from teaching and devoted full time to developing their Angus herd and Yahara Hills Angus Farms.

Frank and Mary Jean were both active in the Wisconsin Angus Association and were supportive of Angus activities. Frank served on the Wisconsin Angus Association Board of Directors from 1991 through 1993. They are benefactors of University of Wisconsin Platteville Beef Facility.
